11.00-18.30 Advanced Techniques in Endoscopic Third Ventriculostomy: Cadaver-Free Skill Enhancement Course

The training program is designed to provide a comprehensive learning experience through both theoretical instruction and hands-on practical sessions. Participants will be grouped into pairs, with a total of five workstations available. Each pair will collaborate at a designated workstation, where they will alternate between the roles of First Operator and Second Operator.

The practical sessions are organized into structured shifts, from 1 to 5. Participants are divided into groups according to the assigned shift number, ensuring an organized and systematic progression through the practical sessions.

Each shift lasts for one hour and is divided into two 30-minute intervals. During the first half of the shift, the trainee assigned as the First Operator will perform the procedure, while the Second Operator observes and assists as needed. After 30 minutes, the roles will be switched, allowing the Second Operator to execute the procedure while the First Operator assumes a supporting role.

This alternating format is designed to ensure that both trainees gain equal hands-on experience and develop proficiency in both leading and supporting roles. The practical sessions are strategically scheduled after an initial entry test and a comprehensive theoretical session to reinforce the concepts learned.

The program is structured into five distinct shifts, commencing at 12:30 PM. This schedule allows each pair ample opportunity to practice and refine their skills under supervised conditions.
